Vlad checked the feed after the session and said we had 64 people on line listening to the lesson. He said they often have 1000 viewers on Sunday morning.

After that class we ran some errands and then had lunch at a local restaurant. It was back to the building to gear up for our afternoon sessions. Ava taught several classes with smaller children. One of the pictures today is of her and a boy from the congregation here who has special needs. He gave her a chocolate bar and told her that he loved her. It brought tears to her eyes as you can imagine.

I worked with a class of adults and high school age children. One of the class members who is older was allowed to have her first opportunity to translate from English to Ukrainian. She did a great job and only occasionally had to ask Kate for help. The last class was their regular Tuesday night class for the church. We studied about the blessings in the book of Revelation.
